The Hunger Games is graphic, emotional, and unputdownable.

Katniss Everdeen, fatherless teenager, hunting with her best friend Gale. Day of the Reaping, where people's names get drawn to enter the Hunger Games. Katniss' sister, Prim, has her name drawn to be part of this year's Hunger Games. Katniss volunteers to save her sister. Training with Peeta, other 'tribute. Peeta savs he's in love with Katniss. The Hunger Games begin. Katniss gets hunted by the Career's and Peeta, who she thought was on her side before the Games. Rue offers Katniss free information to escape the Careers and Peeta, and she makes an alliance with her then. In your summary, be more concise and avoid Rue dies. spoilers - you need to be considerate of what Katniss finds Peeta, who is deathly sick. your reader needs from the text Katniss receives food if she plays the part she is told. Rule that Katniss and Peeta can win together. Games nearly over. Last other tribute dies. Rule reversed and then reinstated! They win together.

The Hunger Games is an amazing book, because the plotline is foolproof, free of plot holes, and has an abundance of twists and turns! Again, nice language choices here.

But most of all, the book is about surviving, not just The Hunger Games, but life. Surviving life, and surviving the Capitol.

The book was emotionally challenging, because it was mostly just sad. At the beginning, you feel Katniss' despair when Prim gets picked, then, later in the book when Rue dies, and at the end of the book, only then does she find happiness surviving the Games and even then her will is not her own. However, a lot of people just view the Hunger Games as violent, and that is because the violence is the cause of her suffering. The most powerful part of the story is when Cato dies, because Katniss realises to what extent the capitol will go for entertainment.

I would entirely recommend this book for other readers, and this is because the book is brilliant, emotionally, and in how it's written.
