

Throughout Collins' novel, we see repeatedly that she conveys the idea of control and power. ^{in the real world} In the beginning, Katniss' narrative voice tells us that surrounding District 12 there is a 'high chain-link fence' with 'barbed-wire loops'. She also tells us that it is supposed to be electrified 24 hours a day, but that it is usually 'silent as a stone'. ~~████████████████████~~ The Capitol has installed this fence, ~~████████~~ thus telling us that, ~~████████~~ they, being in power, try to enclose and contain the people of the district.
 A stone is usually grey, blank, and ~~████████~~ with no personality. It being grey could suggest that the ~~████████~~ Capitol, having installed it, is unnatural. Katniss also tells us there are 'several other weak spots' in the fence, which 'have been loose for years'. This suggests that though the Capitol attempt to trap and contain the people of the districts, they find ways to penetrate this power and control that ~~████████~~ that has been inflicted upon them.
 Thus, Collins conveys the idea of control and power ⁱⁿ the real world in a way which shows that though ~~████████~~ people can be enclosed and contained, ~~████████~~ they can find a way to go through it.
